Getting Started

Take some time to catch up and connect as a group. Pray before discussion. Expect God to move through your time together!

Pacing Your Group

Move quickly through "observation" leaving enough time for "reflection", "discussion", and "surrender."

Scripture Reading

Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

Observation: What does this scripture passage say? Take some time to look up and read: Romans 13

1. What big ideas does Paul work to communicate in these verses about: freedom/liberty in Christ, passing judgment, living in harmony with brothers and sisters in Christ, how to handle differences in conviction?

Reflection and Discussion: What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures? Talk together about how the scriptures connect to everyday life

- 2. Take some time to brainstorm a list of spiritual convictions that can cause conflict between believers or in the church.
- 3. What spiritual conviction do you possess that creates the most conflict with other Christians?
- 4. Strategies for coping with conflicting convictions include:
 - Run from the temptation to quarrel (14:1)
 - Remember we are family (14:3)
 - Resist assuming different convictions are sinful (14:5-6)
 - Respect God's authority to judge (14:10)
 - Refrain from freedoms that might cause others to stumble (14:20-21)
 - Remain on the "high ridge of spiritual discipline" (14:22-23)
 - Rejoice in God's glory (15:5-7)
 - With whom do you most need to employ these coping mechanisms?
 - Identify a strategy where God has given you recent victory, understanding, or breakthrough.
 - Identify a strategy where you need God's help to experience, victory, understanding, or breakthrough.
- 5. How would you explain these passages of scripture to someone who is considering the Christian faith but struggling to understand the heart and ways of followers of Jesus?

Surrender: Responding to God's voice.
