Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

### **Observation: What does this scripture passage say?**

***Take some time to look up and read: Psalm 19:1, Romans 1:20-23, Luke 12:6-7, Job 38:41-39:4***

1. What do these verses tell us about seeing God in nature?

### **Reflection and Discussion: What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures?**

***How do the scriptures connect to everyday life.***

2. Is it reasonable to see God in nature given what we understand from science? Where do you most clearly see and connect the beauty or complexity of nature with God?
3. How is our world precision-engineered for life?
4. How does the Bible help us to see God in nature?
5. What is a right and good response and engagement with nature, given what has been revealed to you in God’s Word, in nature, and in this message?
6. How might you share with someone “fully science minded” or far from God or new to faith to help them see God?

### **Surrender: Responding to God’s voice.**

7. What is one thing God is saying to you through this study and discussion?
