- 1.**REPUTATION**, public esteem, or a good name
- 2.**RECOGNITION**, or merited respect
- 3.PRIVILEGE
- 4.TITLE
- 5.**CREDIT**, one whose worth brings respect of fame
- 6.CHASTITY/PURITY
- 7.**INTEGRITY**, a sense of ethical conduct.
