WOMANHOOD | Destined for Greatness

QUICK REVIEW

Thinking about this week's teaching, was there anything that caught your attention, challenged you, or made you think differently about the message: **Destined for Greatness**.

YOUR STORY

Q: If you could have a superpower that only benefits others — not yourself — what would it be and why?

Q: Think of a woman who shaped your life (a mom, grandma, teacher, or mentor). What's one thing she did that you'll never forget?

DIGGING DEEPER - Destined for Greatness

Robin opened the sermon with a bold claim: **"God created women to be world-changers; and creation is incomplete without them."**

Q: What's your gut reaction to that statement? Does it resonate, surprise, or challenge you?

Q: Culture has a lot to say about what it means to be a woman. Where do you think culture gets it right — and where does it fall short?

The sermon pointed to the Hebrew word **"ezer"** — often translated **"helper"** but more accurately **"deliverer"** or **"sustainer."** It's the same word used to describe God Himself.

Q: How does that reframing change the way you see a woman's role — in the home, the church, or the world?

Robin walked through the "Parade of Deliverers" in the Exodus story — Shiphrah, Puah, Jochebed, Miriam, and Pharaoh's daughter — each one stepping up at a critical moment.

Q: Which of those women stood out to you most, and what does her story stir in you?

Read Aloud: 2 Timothy 1:5-7

Q: Paul points to the faith passed down from Timothy's grandmother Lois and mother Eunice. Who passed faith to you — and are you passing it on?

RESPONSE TO GOD'S WORD

BE ONE - Do we see others as world changers?.

Q: Robin looked straight at the women and said, "Do you realize what this means?" What would it look like for you to actually live this week like you believe God made you to be a world-changer?

MAKE ONE

Q: Who in your life is living like their gods don't see them — empty, searching, or running on fumes? What is one intentional way you can point them to the God who does?
