

Truth:

The Resurrection and the Life

John 11:1-44

Bottom Line: The story of Lazarus is a testament to the glory of God, the love of Jesus, and the ultimate end for *all* who believe Jesus.

In today's passage, Jesus reveals himself, not as a teacher or moral example, but as a merciful Savior and all-powerful Lord. Read John 11:1-44 .

Application & Conclusion:

John says it was this miracle which provoked the Jews to make their ultimate decision to kill him. Caiaphas, the high priest, prophesied that Jesus was going to die on behalf of the nations. That is why the Jews insisted to have him killed, but they thought it was under *their* control. They were wrong about that.

You see, God loves us and he hates sin and death. This is demonstrated in Jesus' interactions throughout the story of Lazarus. That's why God determined, *of his*

own gracious will, to send Jesus to the earth where he would deal with death once and for all. How?

By dying *himself*, lying in a tomb *himself*, and on the third day – coming out of his tomb. It is that resurrection which made Jesus' promise to Martha become a reality for all of us who will be raised after Lazarus. It is his own resurrection which showed all of us that Jesus is really The Resurrection and The Life.

The story of Lazarus is a testament to the glory of God, the love of Jesus, and the ultimate end for *all* who believe Jesus. Because of the person and finished work of Jesus, none who believe will be abandoned to death, but will live.

So then, it is the same question that Jesus asked Martha: Do you believe this?
