

Sermon Notes 04/26/26 – Luke 10:25-37

As Jesus makes His walk to Jerusalem, He is never, not once, in a hurry!

- He stops to eat slow dinners like He has all the time in the world. (*Luke 10:38-42*)
- He stops to pray. Apparently, a long prayer. (*Luke 11:1-13*)
- He stops for children. (*Luke 18:15-17*)
- He stops for a blind man. (*Luke 18:35-43*)

What we see is Jesus wasn't stopping despite the urgency of where he was headed. The STOPPING was the point! (The noticing was the work!)

Slowness does something different. Slowness makes room for the person in front of you to be a person!

In *John 15*, Jesus, the rightful King of the world, was not offering them an audience. He was offering them a home!

The God I am finding on this road is moving at 3 mph and stopping every few steps. The cross is where he is headed, but everything on the road to it is also the point!

The King who never rushes is the King who always has room for you!

Often times, we are rushing people to the cross! Without teaching them to sit at the table of His presence! Communion is what the Lord seeks! (Relationship has always been the goal!)
