

Sermon Notes 06/07/26 – John 15:1-11

Here is what I noticed on the road to Jerusalem. Jesus is not a presenter. He doesn't stand behind a podium and deliver content to a passive audience.

He says something. And He waits:

He tells a story about a Father. (*Luke 15:11-32*)

He encounters a Blind man. (*Luke 18:35-43*)

He tells a story about a Samaritan. (*Luke 10:25-42*)

He encounters a tax gatherer. (*Luke 19:1-10*)

He doesn't push past those moments. He lets them brew. He moves into them.

This is Communion. Something alive, something ongoing, a conversation that keeps going deeper. A relationship in which the more He says the more something stirs in me.

What if the bread and cup are meant to be a door, not a destination?

John 15:1-11: Is not primarily about what you produce. It is about who you are connected to! "*Abide in me as I will abide in you.*" That is the center of gravity. Everything else orbits it!

Weekly Memory Verse:

John 15:1 – I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

Scripture Chapter Challenge: Read *Luke 10*
