

Wholehearted Pursuit

Jeremiah 29:13 “If you look for me wholeheartedly, you will find me.”

God does not hide Himself from hungry hearts. He responds to pursuit, not curiosity, not a divided affection, but to the soul that seeks Him with its full attention and undistracted love. Jeremiah 29:13 is not a riddle to be solved; it is a promise to be trusted. Heaven leans towards those who lean fully toward God.

Wholehearted pursuit is worship before it is obedience. It is the posture of a heart that says, “You Lord, are the priority.” Worship is not confined to songs we sing; it is expressed in the way we seek. When we chase His presence more than His provision, when we desire His face more than His hand, our lives become an offering laid on the altar of devotion.

There is something holy about a undivided hunger. You see God is not impressed with our shiny spirituality, but He is moved by a genuine pursuit. When we come to Him without masks, when we come saying, “Lord, I want You, not just what You can do” He meets us and our worship rises authentically from a heart that has found Him.

Scripture echoes this invitation in **Psalm 27:8 “My heart has heard you say, ‘Come and talk with me.’ And my heart responds, ‘Lord, I am coming.’”**

This is the rhythm of worship: God calls, and the wholehearted heart responds. Pursuit is not striving to earn God’s attention; it is responding to His open invitation. He has already made Himself available. Our role is to fully come to Him completely.

Today, let your worship be more than words. Let it be pursuit. Seek Him in prayer, in stillness, in surrender. Lay aside distractions, lesser loves, and divided loyalties. As you do, trust the promise: when you seek Him with all your heart, you will find Him and that is the greatest act of worship there will ever be.
