God spoke to him saying, My son you must learn to practice my presence, acknowledging that I am always with you regardless of the situation.

I think we can learn a lot from Brother Lawrence's experience. We also must learn to practice God's presence in order to encounter Him moment by moment throughout our daily lives.

God created us and desired our companionship. Why not encounter His Presence right now. He is there all the time-waiting patiently in line.
