- 1. We want to live simply because God calls us stewards, not owners
 - Managing the money God has given to us is different than giving our money away
 - I can be open-handed with someone else's money!
 - Abundance doesn't come from accumulation, but from our relationship with God
 - Spending what I don't have is not the abundant life

Working Diligently

We want to work diligently because

- 1. God has made us for work
 - The Bible mentions work 800 times more than worship, music, praise and singing combined
 - God made us to be co-workers with Him in bringing His purposes, order and Kingdom to earth
 - St. Augustine (4th c) taught that the "spiritual" was more important than the "earthly"
 - The Reformers clarified that we are all priests and we serve God in our regular life:

John 5:17 - "My Father is always at work to this day, and I too am working"





We want to work diligently because

- 1. God has made us for work
- 2. This pleases the God who made us for good work (Eph 2.8-10)
 - We work for the Lord, not for ourselves, for stuff or for others
 - Steward your heart and attitude

Colossians 3.23-24 - Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.

We want to work diligently because

- 1. God has made us for work
- 2. This pleases the God who made us for good work (Eph 2.8-10)
- 3. Hard work is God's provision for us

Phil 4.19 - And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.
