



Ecclesiastes 2

What is Ecclesiastes anyway?

Part of the wisdom literature (Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon), which address the perplexing aspects of life and give us practical wisdom on how to live

Ecclesiastes comes from the Greek "ecclesia" (or civic gathering point) - its a book of instruction for the community

Comes from one who was "the teacher", or "the preacher/instructor"

Written by Solomon

Probably the most unlimited man in history: he had wisdom, intelligence, creativity, artistry, and unlimited money, resource and time to pursue anything and everything any person could or would ever want

Lives out a worldview of lack: "lack of abundance in life comes from a lack of ______

Gives us an opportunity to "test drive" that worldview in the extreme

A Hebrew words used 37 times in this short book, which starts and ends with hevel (1.2, 12.8)

"Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher.

"Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless."

A Hebrew words used 37 times in this short book, which starts and ends with hevel (1.2, 12.8)

literally, smoke or vapor


"meaningless" is not a great translation; nor is "vanity"

- 1. fleeting or temporary Psalm 144.4, Job 7.16, Eccl 11.10
- 2. futile or meaningless because it is illusory and vaporous
 - Jeremiah 10 and Isaiah 57 idols are hevel. They look real and promise something that seem real but when you try to grab it, it slips out of your hands
 - In the same way, achievement, money and pleasure in this world are hevel (1.14, 2.1, 2.11, 5.10)

So is Solomon concluding that life is hevel as a believer in God?!?





