



Ephesians 5:25-28

25 **Husbands**, love your **wives**, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her 26 to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, 27 and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. 28 In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. Luke 13:10–17 (NIV) 10 On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, 11 and a


woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years. She

So come and be healed on those days, not on the Sabbath."

Luke 13:10-17 (NIV)

15 The Lord answered him, "You hypocrites! Doesn't each of you on the

Sabbath untie your ox or donkey from the stall and lead it out to give it water? 16 Then should not this woman, a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has kept bound for eighteen long years, be set free on the Sabbath day from what bound her?" 17 When he said this, all his opponents were humiliated, but the people were delighted with all the wonderful things he was doing.
