HOW TO NEIGHBOR—1 RACISM RECONCILED

But [the man] wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Luke 10:29

<u>But a Samaritan</u>, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he <u>took pity on him</u>. ³⁴ He <u>went to him</u> and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and <u>took care of him</u>. Luke 10:33-34

RACISM IS NOT A <u>SKIN</u> ISSUE. RACISM IS A <u>SIN</u> ISSUE.

But if you <u>favor some people over others</u>, you are committing a sin. You are guilty of breaking the law. James 2:9 NLT

HOW DO WE NEIGHBOR THOSE DIFFERENT FROM US?

1) RECOGNIZE OUR PREJUDICES.

Prejudice: (prejudging) preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience.

- 2) SEEK TO <u>UNDERSTAND</u> OTHERS.
- 3) LOVE THOSE <u>DIFFERENT</u> FROM YOU.

RACISM ISN'T JUST THE PRESENCE OF <u>HATRED</u>. IT'S THE ABSENCE OF LOVE.

There is neither <u>Jew nor Gentile</u>, neither <u>slave nor free</u>, nor is there <u>male</u> <u>and female</u>, for you are all <u>one</u> in <u>Christ Jesus</u>. Galatians 3:28

... There before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from

every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb... ¹⁰ And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." Revelation 7:9-10

For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Romans 10:12-13
