

## REV. DR. MUNTHER ISAAC

The church's task today is to embody Isaiah's vision in miniature, to live it out even while the world resists it. Peace begins within us—between us and God, and then between one another. It shows in how we speak, how we pray, how we resist injustice, how we advocate, how we hope.





# REV. DR. MUNTHER ISAAC

So let Isaiah's vision steady us in these dark days. Let us not surrender to cynicism. Let us imagine, believe, and embody the kingdom that has begun in Christ and will one day be fulfilled. And let us pray as Jesus taught us: "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."
