We Look for the Third Way.

Whenever needed, we reject unhelpful binaries and look for a creative alternative to "this" or "that" thinking. Many difficult issues don't conform to the constraints of limits and loopholes. This was the genius behind the teaching of Jesus and it should point the way for our practice as well.

WE GATHER TO GROW AND SCATTER TO SERVE

1. We ______ – The Church is a living community that supports and encourages everyone to take their next step in spiritual growth.

V. OUR STRUCTURE

GOVERNMENT

APPENDIXES:

I. TERRAFORMA DOCTRINE

OUR APPROACH TO THEOLOGY AND DOCTRINE:

Every movement has shared convictions at its core, beliefs that shape ethos and guide behavior. We find ancient creeds of the church particularly helpful in articulating the essence of orthodoxy (especially the Apostle's Creed and the Nicene Creed). These creeds connect us with the long history of Christian faith. As a community, we are concerned not only with what the creed meant in the early centuries but also its ongoing importance and relevance for faith and practice today.

As we recognize the importance of such guiding principles, we also recognize the diversity of beliefs on finer points of doctrine held by followers of the Jesus Way throughout time. This means we make space for disagreement in our community, and we take a posture of humility and generosity as we dialogue. We are committed to making sure that what matters most gets the greatest emphasis and preventing peripheral matters from distracting and dividing our community. We value conversation above conclusions, listening above lists, and dialogue over debate.

We approach theology as an ongoing conversation with God, Scripture, each other, and historic perspectives as we seek to follow Jesus authentically. Theology happens best in humble dialogue, where questions are encouraged. When Jesus was asked about the bottom line of correct belief, his summary came down to one word: LOVE (Matthew 22:37-40). The Jesus Way is the strong center of our movement and fuels our commitment to loving God and loving people. Our shared love for Jesus can hold us together despite our differences. On disputable matters, our approach is conversational, inquisitive, and accepting (This is what Paul taught in Romans 14). This means we don't all believe the exact same thing on every issue, but we remain committed to the relationship. In other words, there is room at the table for everyone who wants a seat.

We also recognize that the way we live, love, and behave is far more important than the words we put on a webpage or a statement of faith. So we invite you to experience our beliefs in action as we live into the story God is writing in our community. We want to exhibit and proclaim the Gospel in the world through our love and service - to work for the common good.

THE ESSENTIALS:

Scripture:

We believe God inspired the human authors of Scripture by His Spirit to communicate His message of redemption and revelation. The Scriptures are the authoritative and trustworthy record of divine self-disclosure. We believe this collection of stories, songs, poems, letters, histories, and moral codes weave together to form a complete story from first creation to new creation. With the help of the Spirit, we seek to interpret, contextualize, and live out this story even today.

God:

We believe in one eternal and perfect God, revealed in the three persons of the trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is perfect in love and is eager to be known and experienced by all, desiring both loyalty and love from all people. God has revealed himself as a loving Father that desires the best for His children.

Jesus:

We believe Jesus Christ is the Son of God, co-equal with the Father and the Spirit. Jesus entered the human story in the incarnation, becoming fully human and living a life without sin. His death on a cross was the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people. He rose from the dead to demonstrate His power over sin and death and to reconcile all people to God and free them from the power of sin. We look forward to His return where he will consummate the building of His Kingdom.

The Holy Spirit:

We believe the Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son. The Spirit is active and present in the world guiding, empowering, and correcting God's children. The Holy Spirit enables people in their search for God, revealing truth, convicting sin, and transforming lives.

Humanity:

We believe that all people bear the Image of God and have inherent dignity and immense value, regardless of age, socio-economic status, gender, sexuality, race and ethnicity. People were created to have fellowship with God but became alienated in that relationship through sin. We believe that Jesus is reconciling people to God, to each other, and to all creation. We believe that the only answer to the problem of sin is redemption through faith in Jesus.

Sin:

We believe that sin began and continues as willful rebellion against God and rejection of relationship with God. We believe that sin is the source of discord, corruption, and decay that effects all creation. Sin disrupts harmony with God and erodes all human relationships. Jesus came to give His followers abundant and overflowing life, and to rescue them from the power of sin as well as from sin's penalty.

The Church:

We believe the Church is the global gathering of Christ Followers, called to be hands and feet of Jesus in the world. Though it has multitudes of diverse expressions, the Church consists of all who have a relationship with Jesus. The primary purpose of the Church is to advance the Kingdom of God. The Church has a clear scriptural mandate to look beyond its own community to the neighborhood, the nation, and the world as a whole in a posture of love and service. Mission is not a program in the church but an essential identity of the Church. The Church is the missionary people of God sent into all of life to accomplish His purposes.

The Kingdom of God:

The Kingdom of God is any place or person where the rule and reign of Jesus Christ is expressed and experienced. We believe Jesus inaugurated the Kingdom of God in His bodily ministry on the earth and continues to establish it by the Spirit through the Church today. We live in between the inauguration and completion of The Kingdom. God's Kingdom exists eternally in heaven and finds reflection on earth. As God's children, we have been invited to envision and establish God's Kingdom on the earth, building a better future for all. The consummation of the Kingdom will be fulfilled when Jesus returns. Although we believe in eternal life with God, we don't focus on escaping to the afterlife. We see the reality of heaven as a motivating force to inspire us to actively build a better world here and now. This includes protecting and restoring the Earth and the value and dignity of life upon it.

II. SCRIPTURAL MODEL FOR GIVING

1. We give to support the local church.

<u>1 Corinthians 9:13-14</u> – ¹³ Don't you know that those who serve in the temple get their food from the temple, and that those who serve at the altar share in what is offered on the altar? ¹⁴ In the same way, the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel.

Paul roots the concept of church support in the New Testament in the concept of Old Testament "tithing," a system that supported the function of the temple and provided for the priests. Paul communicates that it is appropriate for those who work to preach the gospel to earn their living doing so. In the Old Testament, the operation of the temple rested on this system: the ones that facilitate worship in the temple feed their families on the gifts brought to the temple in worship to God. This is the origin of system for supporting the leaders of the church with the gifts of the church members. But giving to the local church is more than just giving to support the pastors and staff that facilitate the programs of the church. It is also giving to the work of God in the world, which comes *through* the ministry of the church. Sometimes the church gets criticized for being an "inefficient charity," because a large percentage of its money goes to church services and programs instead of to helping the poor like a food bank or orphanage. Now, our church does those kinds of things, too, but we want to challenge this assumption. We think the local church, especially a good church, is the best charity there is. What the church does with all its programs is make disciples – it teaches people to walk in the ways of Jesus and to live out the mission of Jesus into their culture. Saying the church is a "bad charity" is like saying a medical school is a bad hospital: we are in the business of helping transform people – people that leave the church and go into their culture on mission. If the church is doing its job, it should be helping selfish people caught up in greed, gain, and materialism become missional servants known for compassion and generosity. Who do you think started all the food banks, orphanages, hospitals, free clinics, and such? MANY of these programs and institutions were started by disciples of Jesus. And that is what the church makes. So, the church is behind MUCH more actual help to the world than it gets direct credit for. Remember, our goal with money is to be a blessing to the world as God blesses us. Maybe the best way to do this is to support the ministry of making disciples in your local church.

2. We give to support each other.

<u>1 Corinthians 16:2</u> – ² On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made.

The situation here is not that of regular church giving, like that used to support the teachers and pastors, but one of a mercy offering – a gift to help someone in crisis. This might answer some of the questions about "how" giving was done in the early church. "On the 1st day of the week, set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income." They were expected 2,000 years ago to budget and plan with their money to help meet the needs of other people. This is not haphazard or random, but something planned and prioritized. It comes out 1st, and it increases as our income increases. This means giving should be **proportional**. This doesn't happen by accident, it only happens when we prioritize it and plan for it. This is about being available to help when people around you run into trouble. This would include giving to charities that help people and causes of social justice. In the scripture, there is a special emphasis on helping widows and orphans – taking care of vulnerable people with no one else to take care of them.

3. We give as an act of worship and thanksgiving to God.

<u>2 Corinthians 9:6-15</u> – ⁶ Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. ⁷ Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

This passage is about the same situation Paul was talking about in <u>1 Corinthians 16</u>: a collection is being taken in Greece and Macedonia to help the impoverished believers in Jerusalem. Here, Paul gets to the most important element of giving: **what happens or is supposed to happen in our hearts**. We have clichés that hint at this: "It's better to give than receive" and so on. We say this, but if we are honest, we don't always believe it. Sometimes it hurts to give. This is the root of the problem we have with money, and here Paul gives us good medicine. We have a hard time giving because we love money. Paul teaches here to give <u>generously</u> and <u>cheerfully</u>. This happens only in a heart where the ownership issue is settled. From this kind of heart, giving is an act of mercy to the needy and an act of thanksgiving to God. The most important part of our relationship with money is our motivation and allegiance. It is about surrender. We don't give grudgingly because we have surrendered my resources to God (or better, we recognize they are His to begin with!). The talk in this passage about prosperity should not be viewed as a strategy for gain. This shouldn't be understood as "give to God so He will make me rich." That attitude is exactly the opposite of what this is about. It is about a reality of peace and surrender and generosity that goes DEEP in our hearts; so that we don't just do the right things with money but we feel the right way about money.

So, a New Testament picture of giving looks something like this:

It is regular (habitual). Giving is not impulsive. It is not something you make emotional decisions on, based on the manipulative pleas of a fundraiser. It is something you plan and prioritize. Giving is a budget priority, but it is in the budget. It is not "leftovers."

It is joyful. What happens in the heart is an act of surrender and worship to God. It feels good, because there is life in surrender. Your heart rejoices to be a part of God's Kingdom work. It is not something you do reluctantly, but something you do enthusiastically.

It is generous. What is generous? Well, in the Old Testament, the "tax" system of tithing that went to support the temple and the poor was 10% of your wealth or goods. When we define what "generous" looks like now and in our lives, we should take this into account.
