

















Gen. 25:12-18 – These are the generations of Ishmael, Abraham's son....



Backstory

- Gen 12:2-3
 - And I will make of you a great nation
 - And I will bless you
 - And make your name great
 - So that you will be a blessing
 - I will bless those who bless you
 - And him who dishonors you I will curse
 - And in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed



Genesis 14:1-16

Genesis 14:1-2 - In the days of Amraphel king of Shinar, Arioch king of Ellasar, Chedarlaomer king of Elam and Tidal king of Goiim these kings made war with Bera king of Sodom, Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, Shember king of Zeboiim and the king of Bela (that is Zoar)



The Story (Gen. 14:5-6)

Rephaim – giants (Deut. 2:11, 3:11) Zuzim – Probably giants (Zamzummim) - Deut. 2:20) Emim – giants (Deut. 2:11, 3:11) Horites – mountains of the borderlands (frontier Gen. 14:6) Amalekites and Amorites – Near neighbors in valleys (Num. 13:29, 14:25)

Chedarlaomer has a well supplied and far travelling army.

High and low, near and far, Chedarlaomer and his crew have defeated everyone.

The story

Gen. 14:8-9 - Then the king of Sodom, the king of Gomorrah, the king of Admah, the king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela (that is, Zoar) went out, and they joined battle in the Valley of Siddim with Chedorlaomer king of Elam, Tidal king of Goiim, Amraphel king of Shinar, and Arioch king of Ellasar, four kings against five.

Gen. 14:10 - Now the Valley of Siddim was full of bitumen pits, and as the kings of Sodom and Gomorrah fled, some fell into them, and the rest fled to the hill country.

Gen 14:11-12 - So the enemy took all the possessions of Sodom and Gomorrah and all their provisions, and went their way. They also took Lot....

- Gen 14:13-15 Then one who had escaped came and told Abram the Hebrew...
- When Abram heard he led forth his trained men...
- 318 of them and went in pursuit of them as far as Dan...
- [he] defeated them and pursued them to Hobah north of Damascus
- Then he brought back all the possessions, and also brought back his kinsman Lot....






