

Family Movie Night The Watsons Go To Birmingham This Sunday, January 29, 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. Dinner Provided


Come join us for this intergenerational event to wrap up our month of CPC Reads. We'll eat dinner, chat about the book we've been reading, and watch the movie.
