

The Pastor's Class

Seeking the Good Life — A Study of Virtue Sundays: 9:15 - 10:15 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. The Book of Jeremiah offers the following dry assessment of the people of his time:

. "Thus says the LORD:

Stand at the crossroads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way lies; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls. But they said, 'We will not walk in it.'" [Jer. 6:16]

It begs the question, though, "What are these ancient paths, these 'good ways', and how are we to walk in them?"

The Pastor's Class aims to answer by making a survey of moral philosophy focussed on the concept of virtue. First, we will examine the basics of moral philosophy as a foundation upon which we can then engage in a careful study of the *Seven Deadly Sins* and the *Seven Heavenly Virtues*. Pastor Paul will teach about each of these in turn and will suggest a paring of deadly sins with corresponding virtues which we might pursue to avoid the sins. Come join us and bring a friend!
