

You made a covenant with us, and even when we turned from you, you remained ever faithful.


Therefore with all creation we sing your praise:



- represent Cary Presbyterian
- contribute your presence and show the church's interest to the people there,
- benefit from their hospitality,

- show our support for our scholarship students, and
- observe and see life there so you can interpret it to other CPC folks.

We hope to have a project or two to do this trip, and there are always important meetings to attend and record. The children love having people play with them or lead games or crafts.

We want to go this summer! This may allow students (16 and over\*), teachers, families, and others to have this wonderful experience and opportunity. \*A parent or guardian must accompany anyone younger than 19 years old.

We stay in the city, in moderate hotels (clean, with its own bathroom, double or queen beds, and internet). We eat breakfast and dinner in the city and lunch in the village. The flights are easy (one stop in Atlanta), and we have our own driver and van for the whole trip.

We will need to make arrangements for the trip by March 15. A deposit will secure your spot, with the balance due in May.
