

We lift them to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Advent for the Generations: Today after Worship Service

We hope you've marked your calendars for our Intergenerational Advent gathering following worship today. We'll have a simple lunch and then craft Advent decorations together - for both home and church - based on this year's Advent theme From Generation to Generation. All ages are welcome!



Advent means coming or arrival. This word has a double significance, as in Advent we celebrate Christ's coming into the world and look with longing for his coming again. The season of Advent begins with an emphasis on final things (eschatology). We watch and pray with expectant hope for the establishment of God's justice and the return of the Prince of Peace. As the weeks of Advent progress, the focus shifts to thanks and praise for the birth of the one who has already come — Jesus Christ our Savior.

The color of *Sarum blue* was often used in the candles for Advent. This was a mixture of blue and purple — an effort to indicate that Jesus comes both as royalty and as one destined to suffer in the events of Holy Week. The habit of using a pink candle along with the candles of Sarum blue was borrowed from the Lenten habit of shifting the candle for the fourth Sunday in Lent to pink on *Laetare Sunday*. *Laetare* means rejoice, and the pink candle sometimes used in Advent was called *Gaudet*, or joy. You see how these two are easily confused.

In recent times, Advent has undergone a shift in emphasis, reflected in a change of colors used in many churches, both Protestant & Catholic. The more common practice now is to use blue candles to distinguish the Season of Advent from Lent and to omit the pink candle of *Gaudet Sunday*. Blue is used as a symbol of Jesus' royalty.



MARY'S GOLDEN ANNUNCIATION

Mary's Golden Annunciation explores the moment of encounter between Mary and the angelic messenger. This unusual encounter may have been startling to young Mary—a soon-to-be teen bride turned, possibly, unwed mother. Yet, with holy bravery in the face of communal isolation, she accepts the call to be a surrogate mother to a

son who is to be the savior of her people and the son of God.

There is not much commentary regarding Mary's consent to motherhood. She is often portrayed as a humble, yet passive, "accepter" of a fate predestined for her. But I wonder, what if the angel had appeared to Mary and she had declined? Would her name be erased from historic and religious memory in favor of another willing young virgin?

Mary's Golden Annunciation depicts not only a remarkable encounter, but also the moment that divinity in human form was conceived. It is my speculation that the divinity of God entered Mary's body no sooner than Mary's "yes" went out from her mouth. In a time when women had few options other than marriage, Mary's consent to a potentially unwed motherhood is a brave act of subversive agency. In Mary's "yes," uttered in her Magnificat, we see the transformation of a young teenage girl from fearful to determined, from simply accepting to deciding, from passivity to agency, from betrothed to surrogate mother of God—an honor rarer than gold. Perhaps the most remarkable annunciation in this passage is not the messenger's revelation to Mary, but Mary's "yes" to the call.
