### Please Help Middle School Youth & Church World Service

On Sunday, March 27, the middle school youth will assemble hygiene kits for Church World Service. We need your help in collecting the following items.

- One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel, or micro-fiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb removed from its packaging
  - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
  - No pocket combs or picks
  - Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable
- One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from its packaging (either type of clipper is acceptable)
- One bath-size bar of soap in the original package
- One toothbrush in the original package
- Ten standard size Band-Aids
