Is Modern demon possession possible?

- 1. Have you noticed demon possession in the Bible? Appears quite common in the Gospels, no mention in the Old Testament, a few cases in Acts, and then suddenly no mention at all in the Epistles.
 - a. What about the evil spirit sent upon King Saul?
 - i. This spirit is sent by God, not a fallen angel from Satan.
 - ii. Only comes when God's Spirit is removed from Saul.
 - iii. The evil spirit comes and goes at God's command, not a possession or indwelling. Music wouldn't have helped the demon possessed in the Gospels.
 - iv. 1 Sam 16:14-23; 18:10; 19:9.
 - b. What about the medium of Endor? 1 Sam 28:8f.
 - i. Not a demon, but the spirit of Samuel.
 - ii. The medium seems very surprised and/or frightened.
 - iii. Kinda like Moses and Elijah at the Mount of Transfiguration, Matt 17:1ff.
 - iv. Consequences from God.
 - c. Spiritual activity is not the same thing as demon possession. Satan was active in Job's case without demon possession.
 - d. Common in the ministry of Jesus (Mt 4:24).
 - e. Not even mentioned in the Corinthian church (1 Cor 12:27ff).
- 2. Satan ADVERSARY, also known as the devil, Lucifer, the tempter, accuser, etc.
 - a. A created angel of God, probably was an archangel type like Michael (Jude 9)
 - b. Rebelled against God, other angels followed him.
 - i. Demons, also called unclean spirits (Luke 4:33) are fallen angels.
 - 1. What else has super natural powers than angels?
 - 2. No other creature is mentioned...
 - ii. Satan is the prince of the demons, (Mt 12:24; Rev 9:11).

3. The Fall of Satan.

- a. Uncommon View: Satan was cast down during the ministry of Jesus.
 - i. Job how could sinful Satan be in God's presence?
 - ii. Luke 10:18 Jesus saw Satan cast down from Heaven like lightening.
 - iii. Rev 12:9 Satan is cast down after the war in Heaven.
- b. Common View: Satan rebelled before the Garden.
 - i. Satan tempted Adam & Eve to sin, versus James 1:13.
 - ii. Satan and the snake were punished.
 - 1. Crawling on his belly.

2. Prophecy of enmity with the seed of the woman, head and heel bruising.

iii. ADVERSARY - the ACCUSER

- 1. Job slander, incitement, blame.
 - a. Sons of God presented themselves AND Satan.
 - b. Satan's realm or roaming was upon the earth, as with Adam & Eve.
- 2. Opposed Michael the archangel in the dispute over Moses' body (Jude 9).
- 3. David Satan opposed Israel and David (1 Chron 21:1, taking advantage of 2 Sam 24:1f).
- 4. Daniel Gabriel needed help from Michael to fight against the prince of Persia (Dan 10).
- c. A fascinating THIRD Option: Satan fell the same time as man in the Garden?
 - i. Satan was a cherub and wanted what was God's?
 - ii. Isaiah 14:12-15, 22.
 - iii. Ezekiel 28:12-19.
 - 1. Section of Prophecy directed against the King of Tyre.
 - iv. Dual fulfillment prophecy?
 - 1. Compare Isaiah 7:14 and Matthew 1:23.
 - 2. The Egyptian Kings is called a river monster, Ezk 29:3.
 - 3. Family resemblance!
 - a. The Fall of Satan?
 - b. The Fall of Adam?
- d. Satan and his demons were cast into the Abyss awaiting Final Judgement.
 - i. 2 Peter 2:4 and Jude 6.
 - ii. The Abyss is about restricted access or influence (Rev 12).
 - 1. Satan is a roaring lion whom we must resist (1 Peter 5:8f).
 - 2. Why else would you need the full armor of God to stand firm against the schemes of the devil? (Eph 6:10f).

4. The Reach of Satan.

- a. Satan was cast out of Heaven after the Great Rebellion
- b. Satan and his demons were temporarily given more access to humanity during the ministry of Jesus.
 - i. Luke 10:18f compare to Revelation 9:1f.
 - ii. Progressive Parallelism the Book of Revelation.
 - 1. Christ in the midst of the lampstands (1:1-3:22).
 - 2. The vision of heaven and the seals (4:1-7:17).
 - 3. The seven trumpets (8:1-11:19).

- 4. The persecuting dragon (12:1-14:20)
- 5. The seven bowls (15:1-16:21).
- 6. The fall of Babylon (17:1-19:21).
- 7. The great consummation (20:1-22:21).
- iii. Revelation 9:1f the time of the Ministry of Jesus.
- iv. Revelation 12:1f the coming of Jesus and the age of His Church.
- v. Purpose: to demonstrate the sovereignty of Jesus.
- c. Satan and his demons were cast back into the Abyss by Jesus awaiting Final Judgement (Jhn 12:31-33).
 - i. Rev 20:1f.
 - ii. Luke 8:31. Back into the Abyss.
 - iii. He will be Judged (Mt 25:41).
- d. The nature of evil is self-destructive.
- 5. The Promise Romans 8:9ff.
 - a. No demon possession today, thanks to Jesus defeating Satan.
 - b. Zechariah 13:1-2 fulfilled.
 - c. Without Apostles, what remedy would be available today?
 - d. Satan is bound, restricted, or chained awaiting eternal punishment at the Final Judgement.
 - e. Satan and his demons CANNOT overcome the Holy Spirit that is given to dwell in us.
 - f. Satan, while restricted, does exist.
 - i. If you go looking for him, you'll find him!
 - ii. Like a viscous dog on a chain... bound, chained, restricted.
 - 1. Only has the power of deception to pull us in.
 - 2. Only had the power of deception in the Garden.
 - g. IMPORTANT CONCLUSION: Romans 8:37-38. May we be as convinced!
