One of the favorite types of vacations for many of our families is cruising. There is something special about getting out on the open seas, breathing in fresh air, and enjoying lounging on deck. Who doesn't love having beautifully-prepared meals served to them every night? Kim and I had the amazing opportunity to take a cruise in Europe this summer. We visited Spain, Greece, Turkey, and Italy. While being on the boat was great, it was landing in the various ports and discovering the local sites that were truly the highlights. We were able to see La Sagrada Familia in Barcelona, St. John's tomb in Ephesus, the Hagia Sophia in Istanbul, Olympia Greece & the first Olympics, and Rome's historical sites.

It's no surprise that St. Peter, a fisherman by trade, makes a reference to cruising in his first epistle:

"God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 3:20-21

Peter likens our salvation to Noah and his ark, and in doing so, describes our Christian faith less as a leisurely cruise and more like a water rescue! God saved us from our sins through Jesus Christ. By His death, He drowned death. By His might resurrection, He has brought us new and everlasting life. We are now safe, sailing inside the ark of God's grace, the church.

It's interesting that the term we use for the main body of the church is the "nave." That comes from a Latin word, meaning ship. (It's also the origin of our name for the U.S. Navy.) When we enter into the church, it's a reminder that we are safe within God's ship of salvation. The next time you sit in our sanctuary, look up. You'll see beams designed to look like the inside of an ark (turned upside down).

Yet, God did not rescue us for a life of leisure. Saved by His grace, He now calls us to serve together as a Christian crew. Think of it not as cruising, but "crewsing." We are called to serve one another, and to make sure that others come on board this ship of salvation through the waters of baptism and faith. So important is this identity that 1 Timothy 1:19 warns us: "Hold onto the faith and a good conscience. By rejecting this, some have made shipwreck of their faith."

I love this imagery of the church, because it reminds us that our lives are not set adrift on some lonesome vessel. We belong to God. We are part of something bigger than ourselves. We live and serve together as the Crew of Christ.

"Look into my Eyes" by Pastor Robert Jones

One of my favorite amusement park rides is the Indiana Jones ride in Disneyland. The premise of the ride is that those who have gone to this temple have come out with their hearts' desires. That is, of course, if you don't look into the eyes of the idol. Which inevitably you hear the temptation "look into my eyes..." and then you get sent along a terrible and terrific ride. You looked into the eyes of this fictional god and were punished for it.

At the current moment, we have plenty of "eyes" looking at us with the art installation, "Icons in Transformation." If you enter our sanctuary, you are greeted by the works of Ludmila Pawlowska with one of the central motifs being the human eye. Everywhere you look, you see eyes looking in different places. Some are meant to be Jesus' eyes while others are meant to be open to interpretation. However, it has been fascinating to hear the different interpretations of the eyes. Some people find them scary, haunting, or judgmental. Others have seen eyes full of compassion, love, and welcome. This has outlined the subjective nature of art which can be dangerous if it is not rooted in the eternal, divine Truth who is none other than Jesus. Yet, this illustrates perfectly the way that we often view God—is He a wrathful God who is disappointed with us and waiting to strike us with wrath, or is He a kind, loving God who pities us?

In the Old Testament, we're told that Moses wanted to see God, but God would only show him His back because to see His face would cause Moses to die. To look upon God's face would bring about death because God is holy and, we who are sinful, cannot look upon holiness. So, the question becomes "how does God look upon us?" And those questions get answered in the person of Jesus. Throughout the New Testament, we see Jesus looking upon others with compassion such as when the five thousand gathered and were hungry, seeing the grieving widow at a funeral, weeping at the funeral of Lazarus, and even when He is on the cross looking at His mother and John, the beloved disciple. That's not to say that Jesus doesn't get angry either—but it is clear that God is passionate for His creation and cannot stand sin.

Hebrews 12 tells us that Jesus was willing to endure the cross because of the joy that was set before Him—aka the joy of saving us from the power of sin and death. Jesus did not waiver from His mission. He did not faulter and therefore, as St. Paul reminds us, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

So, the next time you are looking at the art in the sanctuary, I would encourage you to look into the eyes of Christ and remember the Word of God to inform how you might look at these eyes. See the eyes of the Savior who loves you enough to die for you. See the eyes of the Savior that looked upon the people with compassion and provides for them. See the eyes of Jesus who kept His eyes fixed on the prize. See the eyes that see all of creation, history, time, and specifically see you.
