God promised (Jeremiah 29:10) to bring them back after 70 years.

That's where Ezra begins...

Ezra 1:2-4

The Persian king decrees the rebuilding of the temple, reversing the Babylonians.

God is sovereign over events and human history.

#### **God Leads**

By providing the means for the work

Ezra 1:6-11

Through a "tax," returning looted items, and freely given offerings.

God stirs the hearts of people to fund the work of ministry. 2 Corinthians 8:9

### People Respond They Go

Ezra 1:5, 2:1-70

42,000+ people, organized for temple service, make the arduous journey.

# People Respond They Rebuild the Altar Ezra 3:1-6

Afraid of the land's new inhabitants, they entreat God's protection by resuming the animal sacrifices.
