Sermon Series: Fail

Opening question: What would you do if you knew you wouldn't fail?

Sermon Synopsis: Financial investors would tell you to buy low and sell high. But how successful are you and I at this? Don't we normally jump on the bandwagon when things are good, and jump off when things go south? What would you do if God asked you to go against the grain, be obedient when things looked bad? What if God gave you the most hope when things seemed the least hopeful?

Bible Reading

Reading the Bible is about reading for practice and spiritual formation – spiritual formation, in which the reader seeks to be formed by the Spirit of God.

Passage(s) from the sermon: Jeremiah 32: 6-8, 9, 15, 26-27, 36-41; 29:11-14

What questions do you have about the passages/sermon?

What do you feel God is saying to you through this passage?

Discipleship Point: Hope is not a feeling, it is a choice.

How has hope shown up in your life?
