



## **Morning Star Las Cruces 2025 Discussion Questions**

August 3, 2025

Series: Wonder: Approaching Faith with Curiosity and Imagination

Title: Look Around

Text: Psalm 8:1-9

1. What's something in nature that made you stop and say "Wow!" recently? Something that made you feel small, amazed or connected?
2. Who in your life has helped you learn how to see the world with curiosity and imagination? How did they do it?
3. What stood out to you in the message titled "Wonder: Look Around?" Did a certain question, story or image spark new curiosity or wonder for you?
4. Read Psalm 8 aloud. What words or phrases strike you most? How does this psalm invite you to see the world—and your place in it—differently?

5. Verse 3 says, “When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers...” What helps you pause and notice God’s presence in everyday things?

6. In verse 4, the psalmist wonders, “What are human beings that you are mindful of them?” How does this question land with you? What does it say about God? About us?

7. Read Genesis 1:26–31. What connections do you see between this creation story and Psalm 8? How do both speak to the responsibility and gift of being human?

8. Read Luke 9:28–36. How might this moment of seeing Jesus in radiant glory connect with the awe and wonder of Psalm 8? What does it mean to look around and glimpse the divine, especially in ordinary places or people?

9. How might you cultivate a sense of wonder and curiosity this week, in your relationships, in your routines, in your prayers?

10. How could your group pray for you as you seek to live with more attention, imagination, and joy?
