

## Morning Star Las Cruces 2025 Discussion Questions

August 10, 2025 Series: Wonder: Approaching Faith with Curiosity and Imagination Title: Ask Questions Text: Luke 2:41–52
1. When you were a kid, what kind of questions did you love to ask (or get in trouble for asking)? As an adult, how do you respond to the repeated questions of kids?
2 Who in your life has encouraged you to ask deep or difficult questions about faith or life? How have they responded to your curiosity? Do you encourage the curiosity of others?
3. What stood out to you in the message titled, "Wonder: Ask Questions?" Did a particular story, phrase or idea open something up for you?
4. Read Luke 2:41–52 aloud. What do you notice in this story about Jesus as a young person? What questions do <i>you</i> have as you read it?

5. Jesus was found "sitting among the teachers, listening and asking questions." What does this teach us about spiritual maturity? How might we practice that kind of holy curiosity?
6. Jesus' parents were confused and even frustrated by his behavior. Have you ever been challenged by someone's questions? Have you challenged others by asking your own questions? What happened?
7. Read Proverbs 4:1–7. What does this passage say about the value of wisdom and understanding? How could it relate to asking questions as a faithful practice?
8. Read Matthew 7:7–11. Jesus says, "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find." How might this invitation encourage us to bring real, even raw, questions to God? How do you read this passage in situations when you are asking and searching but coming up empty-handed?
9. Have you been carrying around a question about God, faith or life lately? One that feels especially important or unresolved? How are you processing that question? With whom could you wonder about it?
10. How can your group pray for you as you continue asking questions, seeking wisdom and growing in faith?
