Title: Covenant
Text: Exodus 3:1–12

1. Share about an experience in which an ordinary moment suddenly felt holy or set apart. What made it feel that way?
2. Who in your life models a deep sense of faithfulness? Who keeps showing up with love and commitment? How has their example shaped you?
3. What stood out to you in the message titled *The Big Idea: Covenant*? Did a word, image or story invite you to think differently about God's promises or call? What did you want to share with your group?
4. Read Exodus 3:1-12. What do you notice about the way God calls Moses? How does Moses respond? Where do you see yourself in his hesitation or questions?

Mission and Vision of Morning Star: To point people to the grace of God found in Jesus through inspirational worship, radical inclusion and the alleviation of suffering.

5. God tells Moses, “I will be with you.” What does that promise mean to you in your own life, especially in times of uncertainty or fear?

6. Covenants are about mutual relationships. God promises to be faithful, and God’s people promise to respond in trust. What does living in covenant with God look like for you today?

7. Read Genesis 17:1-7. How does God’s covenant with Abraham connect to the story of God’s covenant with Moses and Israel? What threads of continuity do you see?

8. Read Matthew 26:27-28. Jesus speaks of his blood as “the covenant, poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.” How does this language shape your understanding of what the new covenant offers, both personally and for the wider community?

9. Where in your life do you sense God calling you to trust more deeply or step forward in faith, as Moses did?

10. How might your group pray for you as you seek to live into God’s covenant of faithfulness and love?
