Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday developed as a day of penitence to mark the beginning of the forty-day period of preparation for Easter. It is a particular time for new beginnings in the faith, a time for returning to the Lord. On this day, we recall our mortality and wait upon the renewing Spirit of the Lord. It is a time to put aside the sins and failures of the past and to grow, by the grace of God, more into the likeness of Christ.

While the use of ashes may be new to you, it has a significant history in Jewish and Christian Worship. From early Old Testament times, ashes have been used as a sign of sorrow, mourning, and penitence. The imposition of ashes is a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation.
