## Pray for God to bless our discipleship.

<sup>11a</sup> To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of His calling...

## Text Message:

- Notice these prayers here were *always* prayed for the church!
- The word "you" in these verses is plural, which means not individual believers, but the Thessalonian church is in mind.
- This means we have all been called and are part of a calling!
   God doesn't only call preachers, He calls creatures;
   God doesn't only call missionaries, He calls ordinaries!
- What does it mean for God to make us worthy of His calling?
- Here's how one modern translation gets at the heart of this:
   This is why we always pray for you, asking our God to help you live the kind of life He called you to live... New Century Version
- o Remember this is not for us as individuals, but as a church.
- In other words, we should pray that we would reflect the love and heart of Christ to one another and to our community!
- Pray this verse this week for the church:
   A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."
