



How Passover Points to Jesus

Exodus 12:1-13

Last Sunday, we looked at how we can apply a simple acronym, CHRIST, to a text of Scripture to see how it points to Jesus.

Today, we're going to slow down and apply this to a biblical text. Whether we apply this acronym or not, it is important we read the Bible with Jesus at the center - this is how Jesus interpreted the Scriptures (Luke 24)! To miss Jesus in the Scriptures is to miss the meaning

of the Bible (as we saw from quotes last Sunday)!

Here are some helpful suggestions to seeing Jesus in the Bible and applying the CHRIST acronym:

- Start with short texts within a chapter of the Bible occasionally.
- Read the text and see where your insights fit into the acronym.
- Use other sources (*1517.org*).
- Interpret all pictures of God according to the fullest picture of God in Jesus Christ [Jesus did! See also Hebrews 1:1-3].

Let's look at the text verse-by-verse and apply the CHRIST acronym:

C.H.R.I.S.T.
