

The Best Words You Will Hear All Day 1 John 2:28-3:3

We abide in Jesus by practicing AWAREness of Him. ²⁸ And now little children, abide in him...

Text Message:

- Underline the last phrase, which are the best words we will hear all day!
- o The idea here is one of continual abiding in Jesus.
- This understanding is reflected in the church calendar, which recognizes both holy days and "ordinary time."
- Jesus is always with us, and we can practice awareness of this truth!
- This doesn't have to be complicated and time consuming but through simple AWAREness of His presence:

Acknowledge: Jesus, thank You for being with me here...

Worship: Jesus, I adore You...

Ask: Jesus, please help me _______.

Return: Jesus, I return to You, renew me in abiding in You...

Experience: Simply experience Jesus' presence at this time.

We abide in Jesus by remembering His blessings. Verses 2:28-3:3:

Text Message:

There are three blessings of abiding in Jesus mentioned here:
 Confidence:

^{2:28} And now, little children, abide in him, so that when he appears we may have confidence and not shrink from him in shame at his coming.

Identity:

3:1a See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are.

Hope:

^{3:2} Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears[a] we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.

 "In eternity, Christians will be morally without sin, intellectually without falsehood or error, physically without weakness or imperfections, and filled continually with the Holy Spirit." ESV Study Bible note for 1 John 3:2

We abide in Jesus by practicing righteousness. Verse 29:

Text Message:

- John writes this in the first century to distinguish between Christ-followers and those following proto-Gnostic teaching.
- Remember, the proto-Gnostic false teachers emphasized a secret knowledge regarding supposed deep sayings of Jesus.
- In contrast, John emphasizes following Jesus in Christlike behavior.
- Christlike behavior is the fruit of abiding in Jesus, not by trying harder to live as we should.
- The Walk of Faith and Abiding in Jesus:
 FEELINGS FACTS
- IF I look to the facts (truth) of who I am in Christ, I will walk by faith and bear fruit.
- o IF, instead, I look behind to my feelings, I will certainly fall!
