

Abiding in Jesus: Part II
John 15:1-11

In Jesus, we can experience answered prayer. Verses 7-8:

Text Message:

- o Could this promise of answered prayer be any clearer?
- o Note how specific the promise is: "... it will be done for you."
- o Could there be something foundational that we're missing?
- o It is important to note that verses 7-8 flow together.
- o In other words, the context of answered prayer is fruitfulness!
- o Let's look at a biblical example of this from Acts 4:23-31, and how Jesus' disciples lived His promise of answered prayer:
 - 1)Their prayer was communal (Acts 4:24a).
 - 2) Their prayer was scriptural (Acts 4:24b-26).
 - 3) Their prayer was missional (Acts 4:27-30).
 - 4) Their prayer was powerful (Acts 4:31).
- o Notice how their prayer fits hand-in-glove with the Lord's

- Prayer regarding God's name and kingdom.
- o Interestingly, what follows in Acts 4 is all their needs being provided for (Verses 32-34).
- o Isn't this what Jesus has promised elsewhere: The thing you should want most is God's kingdom and doing what God wants. Then all these other things you need will be given to you. Matthew 6:33, International Children's Bible

In Jesus, we can experience His love.

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.

Text Message:

- o The word "abide" appears 10 times in John 15:4-11.
- **o** As Jesus earlier connected answered prayer to fruitfulness (verses 7-8), so here the connection of abiding in His love is connected to keeping His commandments.
- **o** This is not the first time Jesus speaks of obeying His commandments (See John 14:15), so this is not an optional part of discipleship.
- **o** Jesus' commands can be boiled down to loving God and loving people (Matt. 22:34-40, Mark 12:28-34, Luke 10:25-28).
- **o** When Jesus said, "Do this and you shall live" (Luke 10:28), He was talking about life here-and-now, as well as in the afterlife.

In Jesus, we can experience His joy.

¹¹These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

Text Message:

- o We've seen how Jesus promises the experiences of His love and joy- What about the times when we're not experiencing this? When life hits hard, or simply the "wear and tear" of life?
- o Do these promises promise immunity to feeling down or depressed or heartbroken or frustrated or...
- o Some considerations:
 - 1)Both Jesus and His disciples shed tears, and the Apostle

Paul writes of despairing of life (See 2 Corinthians 1:8!).

- 2)Even through the worst of circumstances, there was a return to joy (See 2 Corinthians 7:4!).
- o Sometimes what we need is not more "down time" but some "shut-down time" with Jesus!
- o "All of humanity's problems stem from man's inability to sit quietly in a room alone." Blaise Pascal, French philosopher
- o May we be people who sit quietly in a room alone with Jesus!
