The Most Important Choices You'll Make this Christmas Luke 2:1-21

The choice of what will be most important in life. Verse 1:

Text Message:

- We may sing of "We Three Kings," but the Christmas Story in Luke is the story of two kings- Caesar and the newborn Christ.
- These kings represent for us what is most important in life.
- In other words, something or someone will be king in your life!
- Something or someone will reign supreme!
- o King Caesar here represents much of what our world values:
 - 1) He brought peace and prosperity to the known world...
 - 2) He is recognized historically as an administrative genius.
 - 3) The economy flourished under his reign (job security) ...
 - 4) He's been described as "unusually handsome... graceful... calm and mild" in biographies.
- o In other words, he had all of what is chased after in life.
- And yet, unlike the newborn king, had no ability to impart life!
- This is the testimony of the ages by those who followed lesser kings, only to find true life in the King whose birth we celebrate this evening.
- Christmas is a great time to do a heart check as to what is king in our lives: Is it King Jesus or a lesser king?

The choice of what values will shape your life. Verses 3-7:

Text Message:

- o Again, we see the contrast of two kings and kingdoms.
- Joseph and Mary are our examples here- they're living in the kingdom of Caesar but it's not the kingdom they're living for.
- The question is not what kingdom are you living in, but what kingdom are you living for?
- What values are shaping your life? Are they what is important to Christ, or what is important to the world around us?
- Is your life a testimony of living for the kingdom of God, or an echo of everyone else's life?
- Our lives are either being shaped by a lesser kingdom or the kingdom of Christ- one decision at a time!
- God has given us the gift of Jesus Christ and the gift of choice, and what we choose will determine the innermost qualities of our life:
 - Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. Galatians 6:7

The choice to trust Jesus in mystery and rejoicing. Verses 8-21:

Text Message:

- Notice the Christmas story is filled with rejoicing and mystery and give a foretaste of what it looks like to trust Jesus.
- Certainly, there are times of great rejoicing in following Jesus and experiencing the thrill of trusting Him in and with all of life.
- o But there is also great mystery, as there was at Jesus birth.
- Often Verse 21 is lopped off the Christmas story because it takes place eight days later, but did you know the shepherds were rejoicing in this king and didn't even know His name?
- This third choice reminds us to trust in Jesus even when we don't know or understand the stuff life throws our way.
- The shepherds didn't know His name, and there is much we don't know, but will we choose to trust?
