

Ephesians 4:11-16





¹⁶ Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers.



#1. Doctrine Equips the Church for Ministry (vv 11-12)



Apostles (Established the Truth)
Prophets (Boldly Declared the Truth)
Evangelist (Advance the truth)
Shepherd (Guide to Live Out the truth)
Teachers (Explain the truth)



**#3. Doctrine Produces Spiritual Maturity.
(v 13)**

²⁸ Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

¹² For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. 





#4. Doctrine Protects & Anchors the Church (v 14)



“Doctrine is the rudder that steers the ship of the soul.” – Augustine

⁶ I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— ⁷ not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. ⁸ But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed. ⁹ As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed.



#5. Doctrine Unifies the Church (v 13)



1 Timothy 1:5


