## **Sermon Summary:**

This sermon explores the genealogy in Genesis 5, emphasizing the recurring theme of death as a consequence of sin. It contrasts the inevitability of physical death with the hope of eternal life through faith in God. Pastor Bruce Gordon highlights God's faithfulness in judgment and mercy, using the examples of Adam's lineage to illustrate the human condition and the need for salvation. The sermon concludes with a powerful call to make decisions for Christ without delay, as the time of death is uncertain for all.
