There's something powerful about someone's last words. And that is especially true of the final words Jesus spoke from the cross. The gospel writers recorded seven sayings of Jesus from the cross, seven last words, and these sayings are the focus of our Lent series. As we prepare our hearts for the celebration of resurrection on Easter Sunday, we are taking a closer look at these final words Jesus spoke before he died on the cross and discover their significance for us today.

## The Gathering


(The congregation is invited to gather outside & process in while waving palms on the opening song.)

#### PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL

- P: When Jesus and his disciples had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethpage at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,
- C: "Tell the daughter of Zion, 'Look, your King is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."
- P: The disciples went on and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and followed were shouting.
- C: "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"
- P: When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking "Who is this?" The crowds were saying...
- C: This is the Prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."
- P: Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."



## The Word

FIRST READING Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens— wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

#### **CELEBRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION**

P: God is with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Lift up your hearts.

C: We lift our hearts to God.

P: Let us give thanks to God, our God!

C: We give God our thanks and our praise!

P: On this day of celebration – on this day of renewing our faith – on this day of walking with the Christ, to Jerusalem... to Golgotha... and beyond – we give you thanks, great and loving God.

C: Thank you, loving God!

P: From the very beginning, you have loved us.
You created all that is, calling it into being.
With the ruach – the Spirit – with the Wind and the Word,
you saw what you had created,
and called it, "Good!"

P: Through prophets, priests and storytellers, through mothers and grandmothers, through fathers and grandfathers, through teens and children and infants, you called us back to your love.

P: There came a time when you sent Jesus to speak to the world.

To speak to us.

To teach us your love.

To give abundant life.

To make us new.

## C: Thank you, loving God!

P: He lived a life as one of us – a child, a youth, an adult.

He laughed with those who laughed,

he cried with those who cried.

In all of this, he walked the hard road –

## C: the way of the Cross and the way of the Resurrection.

P: On the night before he was put to death,

he gathered for a meal of celebration with his friends.

There he recommitted himself to your love, and to his people.

He took bread, thanked You, and broke the bread, giving it to his friends, saying,

"Take this and eat it. This is my body, given for you.

Each time you do this, remember me."

## C: We remember him.

- P: After the meal was over, he took the cup of blessing, thanked You, and poured the wine, giving it to his friends, saying, "Take this and drink it. This is my blood, given for you. Each time you drink this, remember me."
- C: We remember him.
- P: And so we do as he asked us, loving God.

  We pray that your Spirit might fill these gifts,
  and fill us that all might be vessels of your love,
  your hope and your life in the world.
- C: Come, Holy Spirit, come!


#### **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

- C: Thanks be to God.


#### **COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION**

#### PASSION DRAMA

NARRATOR: Now Jesus stood before the Governor, and the Governor asked him,

PILATE: Are you the King of the Jews?

NARRATOR: Jesus answered, "You say so." But when he was accused by the chief priest and elders, he did not answer. Then Pilate said to him,

PILATE: Do you not hear how many accusation they make against you?

NARRATOR: But he gave them no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the Governor was accustomed to releasing a prisoner for the crowd, anyone whom they wanted.

At that time they had a notorious prisoner called Barabbas.

So after they had gathered, Pilate said to them:

PILATE: Whom do you want me to release for you, Barabbas or

Jesus who is called the Messiah?

NARRATOR: And the people shouted....

CROWD: Barabbas! Barabbas!

PILATE: Then what should I do with Jesus, this man who is called

the Messiah?

CROWD: Let him be crucified!

PILATE: Why, what evil has he done?

CROWD: Let him be crucified! Release Barabbas! Let him be crucified!!

NARRATOR: So when Pilate saw that he could do nothing, but rather that a

riot was beginning, he took some water, washed his hands

before the crowd, saying...

PILATE: I am innocent of this man's blood—see to it yourselves.

NARRATOR: Then the people as a whole answered:

CROWD: His blood be on us and on our children!

NARRATOR: So he released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified. Then the soldiers of Pilate took Jesus into the Governor's headquarters and gathered the whole court around him. They stripped him; put a scarlet robe on him, and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a reed in his right hand and knelt before him and mocked him saying, "Hail, king of the Jews!"

They spat on him and took the reed; struck him on the head. After mocking him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots and then they sat down there and

kept watch over him. Over his head they put the charge against him, which read: "THIS IS JESUS, KING OF THE JEWS." Then two thieves were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying....

CROWD: You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross.

NARRATOR: From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, Iama sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

And when some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man called for Elijah". At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick and gave it for him to drink. But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to see him." Then Jesus cried again and breathed his last.

At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook and the rocks were split. Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and he said...

CENTURION: Truly, this man was God's Son!
