- "The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul." (Psalm 19:7)
- "It is **impossible for God to lie.**" (Hebrews 6:18)
- "The Lord <u>detests lying lips</u>, but he <u>delights in men who are truthful.</u>" (Prov. 12:22)

Four ways the Ninth Commandment speaks into our lives.

1 in Court: Destroying Justic

• <u>Perjury</u>. The willful taking of an oath in order to tell or confirm anything known to be false was a serious act, since it <u>profaned God's name</u> by using it in vain, and irreverently defied and disregarded God's omniscience.

"'Do not <u>swear falsely</u> by my name and so profane the name of your God. I am the LORD. (Lev. 19:12)

There are <u>six things the Lord hates</u>, seven that are detestable to him: haughty eyes, <u>a lying</u> <u>tongue</u>, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked schemes, feet that are quick to rush into evil, <u>a false witness who pours out lies</u> and a man who stirs up dissension among brothers. (Prov. 6:16-19)

"Again, you have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not break your oath, but keep the oaths you have made to the Lord.' 34 But I tell you, **Do not swear at all: either by**heaven, for it is God's throne; 35 or by the earth, for it is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the Great King. 36 And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make even one hair white or black. 37 Simply let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one. (Matt. 5:33-37)
