Which is why this book is one of the greatest biblical case studies on **spiritual leadership**.

Paraphrase based on Charles R. Swindoll, Hand Me Another Brick:

“Nehemiah stands as a **classic example of leadership** because his life shows us how a leader must begin **with clear vision from God**, remain **rooted in prayer**, face opposition with courage, and **pursue the task** with steadfast perseverance. He didn't just dream of rebuilding Jerusalem's walls—he prayed for God's guidance, he boldly asked for the king's favor, he confronted discouragement and ridicule, and he stayed true to the task until the work was finished. In Nehemiah we see that great leadership is not built on position or popularity, but on a vision that is sustained by dependence on God and unwavering resolve.”

### HOW DO YOU GET A VISION?

#### 1. VISION STARTS WITH A \_\_\_\_\_

*During the month of Chislev in the twentieth year, when I was in the fortress city of Susa, 2 Hanani, **one of my brothers, arrived with men from Judah, and I questioned them about Jerusalem and the Jewish remnant** that had survived the exile. 3 They said to me, “The remnant in the province, who survived the exile, **are in great trouble and disgrace. Jerusalem’s wall has been broken down, and its gates have been burned.**” CSB (Ne 1:1–3).*

*LORD, the **God of the heavens, the great and awe-inspiring God** who keeps his gracious covenant with those who love him and keep his commands, 6 let your eyes be open and your ears be attentive to hear your servant's prayer that I now pray to you day and night for your servants, the Israelites. (Ne 1:5–6).*

##### • CONFESSING \_\_\_\_\_

*I confess the sins we have committed against you. Both **I and my father's family** have **sinned.** 7 We have acted corruptly toward you and have not kept the commands, statutes, and ordinances you gave your servant Moses. (Ne 1:6–7).*

##### • PRAYS THE \_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 8-10)

##### • MAKE A PETITION FOR \_\_\_\_\_

*Please, Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of your servant and to that of your servants who delight to revere your name. **Give your servant success today, and grant him compassion in the presence of this man.** (Ne 1:11).*
