WHAT IS THE KINGDOM OF GOD?

"The Kingdom of God is where God reigns and particularly where He reigns over men and women." K.L. Schmidt

"The Kingdom of God is His kingship, His rule, His authority." George Ladd

"The sovereign activity of God as king in saving sinners and overcoming evil, and the new order which is thus established." Dictionary

TheNewTestament refers to the Kingdom of God as a **Future (eschatological) event** and a **PRESENT reality.** So the Kingdom of God is **Already HERE and Not Yet HERE.**

HOW DOES THE KINGDOM GROW?

1.	Jesus Tells a Story about KINGDOM!	
•	Again Jesus began to teach by the lake. The crowd that gathered around him was large that he got into a boat and sat in it out on the lake, while all the people were the shore at the water's edge. (Mk 4:1).	
•	Listen! (!) A farmer went out to sow his seed. (Mk 4:3).	
	 This "Listen!" is Jesus' command to the hearers to open themselves up to Jesus to the word he is giving them, to become <u>receptive</u>, <u>porous</u>, <u>deeply attentive</u>. 	and

2. _.	THE WORD OF GOD!	
•	The farmer sows the word. (Mark 4:14)	
•	I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but <u>God made it grow.</u> 7 So neither he who planted he who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow . (1 Co 3:6–7).	
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	MOVES FROM ONE STAGE TO ANOTHER.
	ord sometimes lies on the hard surface of the hearers' lives, allowing a chance to quickly swoop down and snatch it away.
	 Some people are like seed <u>along the path</u>, where the word is sown. As soon as they hear it, Satan comes and takes away the word that was sown in them. (Mk 4:15).
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	ord sometimes lands <u>in a rocky place</u> . People hear the word with joy, cking any root, they fall away when trouble comes.
	• 16 Others, like seed sown on rocky places, hear the word and at once receive it with joy. 17 But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. (Mk 4:16–17).
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	 Ford sometimes lands in <u>a thorn patch</u>. The word is heard, but soon gh worldly cares, wealth, and other distractions <u>choke the word</u>. Still others, like seed sown among <u>thorns</u>, hear the word; 19 but the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth and the desires for other things come in and <u>choke the word, making it unfruitful.</u> (Mk 4:18–19).
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• The w	ord sometimes lands on the good soil. The word is heard and oted.
	 Others, like seed sown on <u>good soil</u>, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop—<u>thirty</u>, <u>sixty or even a hundred times what was sown</u>." (Mk 4:20).
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
