EYEWITNESS - _____, THE QUITTER (FALTERING FAITH)

John Mark is influenced by many _____ of Jesus Christ.

- When this had dawned on him, he went to the house of Mary the mother of John, also called Mark, where many people had gathered and were praying. 13 Peter knocked at the outer entrance, and a servant girl named Rhoda came to answer the door. 14 When she recognized Peter's voice, she was so overjoyed she ran back without opening it and exclaimed, "Peter is at the door!" (Acts 12:12-14)
- She who is in Babylon, chosen together with you, sends you her greetings, and so does my son (like a son) Mark. 1Pet. 5:13

Paul and Barnabas are _____ John Mark

When Barnabas and Saul had finished their mission, they returned from Jerusalem, taking with them John, also called Mark. (Acts 12:25)

The two of them, sent on their way by the Holy Spirit, went down to Seleucia and sailed from there to Cyprus. 5 When they arrived at Salamis, they proclaimed the word of God in the Jewish synagogues. John was with them as their helper. (Ac 13:4–5).

SOMETHING WENT

They traveled through the whole island until they came to Paphos. There they met a Jewish sorcerer and false prophet named Bar-Jesus, 7 who was an attendant of the proconsul, Sergius Paulus. The proconsul, an intelligent man, sent for Barnabas and Saul because he wanted to hear the word of God. (Acts 13:6–7)

But Elymas the sorcerer (for that is what his name means) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul from the faith. Acts 13:8

From Paphos, Paul and his companions sailed to Perga in Pamphylia, where <u>John left</u> <u>them to return to Jerusalem</u>. (Acts 13:13)

SHARP DISAGREEMENT

Some time later Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us go back and visit the brothers in all the towns where we preached the word of the Lord and see how they are doing." 37 **Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark, with them**, 38 but **Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them** in Pamphylia and had not continued with them in the work. 39 They had such a sharp disagreement that they **parted company**. Barnabas took Mark and sailed for Cyprus, 40 but Paul chose Silas and left, commended by the brothers to the grace of the Lord. 41 He went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches. (Acts 15:36-40)
