4. What difference does dying with Christ make to your sense of identity? See Rom. 6:11; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; Gal. 2:20; 1 Pet. 2:24
5. Do you truly believe that you don't *have* to sin? What difference does/would that truth make?
6. In what area of your life have/are you finding victory over sin?
7. In what area of your life is fighting sin still particularly hard at the moment?
