

Read Galatians 4:21-31

1. As you read this text and think through the sermon, what stands out to you, encourages you, or challenges you?
2. In Paul's allegory, what do **Hagar and Sarah** represent? How does this help us understand the difference between living under **law** and living under **promise**?
3. The sermon emphasized that everyone is either an "Ishmael" or an "Isaac." What does that mean practically? How might someone who professes faith still live as if they are "under the law"?
4. Galatians 4:29 teaches that the child born according to the flesh persecuted the child born according to the Spirit. Why do you think grace so often provokes opposition, even from religious people?
5. If we truly believe we are heirs of God's promises, how should that shape the way we handle guilt, failure, obedience, and joy this week?
