Discussion Questions:

In what ways can we apply the pastor's suggestion to read one book or passage repeatedly for deeper understanding to our own Bible study?

How does the idea that 'only God can explain our purpose' impact our approach to seeking meaning in life?

What role does the Holy Spirit play in our understanding of Scripture, and how can we be more open to His guidance?

How might our view of God's creativity in nature (like the goblin shark) enhance our appreciation for His creativity in Scripture?

In what ways can we rekindle our 'first love' for God and His Word when we find ourselves becoming spiritually lukewarm?
