Another coming of Spring event that we will observe is another thing that I enjoy, that is Daylight Savings Time. If you were wondering why the Vernal Equinox is at 11:06 PM EDT, it takes place after Daylight Savings so instead of Eastern Standard Time (EST), we will be in Eastern Daylight Time (EDT). ## Intern's Inklings

### The Seven Churches of Revelation,

Part III: Letter to the Church of Pergamum: Revelation 2:12-17

The culture is becoming increasingly hostile to Christianity and specifically the local church. Gone are the days when most everyone went to church on a weekly basis. It is now no exaggeration to say that we dwell "where Satan's throne is." The city of Pergamum was similar since it was a city with prevalent idolatry. It was known for its altars to the emperor, Zeus, and the god Aesculapius, who was a god of healing pictured under an emblem of a serpent. This emblem of the serpent represented Satan for many Christians. Pergamum was a heathen place. Yet a church was started there and stayed true to faith in Jesus.

The letter, however, does not end there with that encouragement. There is a significant sin issue in the church of Pergamum. They are compromising with false teachings of "Balaam" and the "Nicolaitans." For context, read Numbers 22-24 to hear about the story of Balaam. The Moabite King named Balak told Balaam to curse the Israelites, but God stopped Balaam from cursing and made Balaam bless Israel instead. Balaam, however, was filled with greed and so he conspired to send Moabite women to seduce the Israelite men and persuade them to take part in sexual sin at the feasts to heathen gods.

The story of Balaam was meant to show how effectively Satan uses sexual temptation to tempt and destroy those in the church. It is also a clear reminder for us to remember Jesus and not become too comfortable in our salvation, thinking that we can never be tempted as Christians. The reality is that we will struggle with sin until we go to heaven, or until Christ comes back.

What is the exhortation for those who compromise with the world? The answer for the Pergamites, and for us today at Faith Church in 2024, is repentance and discipline. Repentance and discipline are incredibly difficult and unpopular. God calls us to repent of sin and turn away from that sin. The church in Pergamum also lacked discipline. If we love the church and the purity of it, then we should desire the accountability that discipline provides. Discipline is primarily meant to restore the individual back to the local church community.

This section closes with an interesting reference to "hidden manna" and "white stone" in verse 17. Hidden manna is a reference to God's provision of food to his chosen people who were wandering in the desert. This is contrasted with the food given to idols in verse 14. We also need to rely upon the sustenance that God gives us. This is a reminder to us as well that we must not compromise the clear message of the Gospel. The white stone is the special righteousness that God gives to us through Jesus, and it is the invitation to the grand wedding feast upon Christ's return.

This all applies to Faith Church today. We must be careful to not compromise the Gospel that is found in Scripture for it is the good news that we must also preach to ourselves in every moment. May we at Faith Church stay true to the Gospel of Jesus, and may we proclaim and show the Gospel to a watching world.


