Psalm 94

(Tune: "Glorious Things of Thee are Spoken")

- 1.God of vengeance, O Jehovah, God of vengeance, O shine forth! Rise up, O You Judge of Nations! Render to the proud their worth. O LORD, how long shall the wicked, How long shall the wicked boast? Arrogant the words they pour out, Ill men all, a taunting host.
