

Featured this month are John and Rachel Clifford. John, from Cape Town, South Africa, and his wife Rachel, from the U.S., have dedicated their lives to mission work across Africa. They settled in Kigali, Rwanda, after John studied at Reformed Theological Seminary in Washington D.C. In Kigali, they support new church plants, train leaders at a Bible college, and manage a missionary internship program, aiming to make Kigali a hub for dispatching missionaries and church leaders throughout Africa. Their work is crucial in developing gospel-centered communities across the continent.
