Overview:

The Gospel (Good News) is something we must be familiar with and belongs to every person who follows Jesus, not just professional ministers:

- John 3:16 both really bad news and the best news ever. V18 the urgency to pass this news.
- The Gr. Commission (Matt 28:18-20) will learn about an authority & activity given to all of us by Jesus himself.
- Three tools you can start using today with your own FRANCES.

"16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him. 18 Whoever believes in Him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God." — **John 3:16-18 ESV**

• Bad news: we are all sinners, lost and incapable of saving ourselves.

- Good News: In Jesus, God made a way back to Himself, back to life free from guilt and condemnation, and eternal life is freely given.
- V18: those who reject Jesus, will experience eternal separation from God and infinite, conscious torment in hell


"18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."" - Matthew 28:18-20

- 1. Authority: Jesus has all authority. We may obey Him without fear. He is in control.
- 2. **Activity**: Command to "make disciples" while we are going. We should be witnesses for Jesus Christ and seek to win others to Him.

Discipleship = become progressively like Christ in 1-character, 2-in conduct, 3-in attitudes, and 4-actions.

3 Practical Tools:

Tool #1 – FRANCES List: Take Action = Create your FRANCES List & BLESS.



Tool #2 – Kindness Cards: <u>Take Action</u> = Get 2-3 cards & be kind to others.

Tool #3 - 3 Gospel Circles: Take Action = Practice it w/family & be familiar.



<u>Take Action</u> = **Be willing to Evangelize NOW** and Join God's rescue plan.
