## Baptism: an **ILLUSTRATION** of God's Resurrection Story

#### Acts 2:36-40 (NIV)

"Therefore, let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah." When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."

With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." **Those who accepted his message were baptized**, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

Big Idea: Jesus offers real, eternal life, a better life than you ever imagined.

## Baptism is a:

- RESPONSE to the Gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ.

### What is the GOSPEL?

- God created us to be with Him. (Ps 100:3, Eph 2:10)
- Our sins separate us from God (Isa 59:2, Rom 3:23, 6:23)
- Sins cannot be removed by good deeds. (Isa 64:6, Rom 3:20)
- Paying the price for sin, Jesus died and rose again. (1 Pet 3:18, Eph 1:7)
- Everyone who trusts in Him has eternal life. (Mk 16:16, Rom 10:13, 1 Cor 6:11)
- Life with Jesus starts now and lasts forever. (Jn 3:16, 5:54, 10:9-10)

# **Baptism is:**

- a **PUBLIC** declaration of a new association.
- a **PERSONAL** declaration of a new association.
- not a <u>CONDITION</u> of salvation.
- an **EVIDENCE** of a personal decision to follow Jesus.

## At Manna We Believe

Water baptism is a beautiful picture of what our Lord has done for us. Our immersion in the water, symbolizes burial with our Lord; we are baptized into His death on the cross and are no longer slaves to self or sin (Romans 6:3–7). When we are raised out of the water, we are symbolically resurrected -- raised to new life in Christ to be with Him forever, born into the family of our loving God (Romans 8:16). Baptism also expresses unity with all the saints (Ephesians 2:19), that is, with every person in every nation on earth who is a member of the Body of Christ (Galatians 3:27–28). Water baptism does not save us. Instead, we are saved by grace through faith, apart from works (Ephesians 2:8–9). We are baptized because our Lord commanded it: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19).
