## Reflect and Respond

- 1. Reflect and discuss the repeating phrase in Genesis 1 (see the front page). Is there any comparable way to express the boundaries of each of the six marked days of creation?
- 2. Genesis 2 places us in the scene as God unfolds what He does. He creates Adam with perfect communication and thinking abilities, and has him name significant animal kinds. But, God says that Adam needed a helper. This leads to God's forming the first woman, and he personally brings her back to him. What does this say to you about God's intention and desire for people to know his love? What does it say about his design for marriage, in particular?
- 3. In Job 40 and 41, God challenges Job to respond to him and ends his discussion with a description of two creatures (one on the land and one in the sea). They are extinct today but were apparently known by Job. So, what do you think of God's argument, as he points to his creation before Job finally responds in Chapter 42?
